

#### PALMS FOR ASH WEDNESDAY ASHES

If you have palms in your homes from previous years, please bring them to the church <u>by Sunday</u>, <u>February 11<sup>th</sup></u>. There are baskets in the main entrance of the church for the palms.

On Tuesday, February 13<sup>th</sup> the Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper will be served by the Knights of Columbus from 3pm to 6pm. At 6pm we will celebrate the Rite of Burning the Palms followed by Mass. These ashes will be used Ash Wednesday.



# BIBLE STUDY "OREMUS" (Let us Pray)

Beginning February 21st to March 27th, the Bible Study "Oremus" will be held every Wednesday from 7PM to 8:30PM (except Ash Wednesday) for six weeks.

This is a great opportunity during the season of Lent. There will be a video presentation by Rev. Father Mark Toups, round table discussions, opportunity for questions and answers, and Prayers.

#### **Healing Our Inner Pharisee**

The phrase "healing your inner child" is a pop-psychology mainstay. The idea is that we can only become well-adjusted adults if

we have made peace with the issues of our childhood. It is a sensible idea, and one I'd like to borrow to confront another character who dwells within all of us; our inner Pharisee.

The Pharisees were appalled that Jesus did not observe the fine points of the law. And Jesus had little patience with the superficial behavior of the Pharisees, who had perhaps forgotten the true purpose of the laws they so scrupulously upheld. "He looked around at them with anger; he was grieved at their hardness of heart" (Mark 3:1). Yet most of us have a Pharisee lurking in our psyche.

My inner Pharisee plagues me. When I was a child, my mother called me her "little Pharisee," because I came home from school with stories of the wrong-doing of the other kids—things that I, of course, never did. It's easy to be a little Pharisee when you are the perennial teacher's pet.

When I was a church employee, my inner Pharisee was especially well-nourished. When someone asked the time of an activity, I would answer warmly but think, "Well, if you'd read your bulletin, you would know, wouldn't you?" When a parent complained that she could not convince her child to attend confirmation class, I would nod sympathetically but think, "Well, maybe if you showed up for Mass, your kid would come to class." My inner Pharisee grew out of control.

Fortunately, God made me a parent, which humbles and humanizes me, and makes me aware of how far from holiness I am. My inner Pharisee is silenced whenever one of my daughters does something that makes me look bad. Parenting is one antidote to the inner Pharisee, as it makes us more compassionate and less judgmental, especially of those who share with us the struggles and joys of parenting.

Certainly laws matter; there are specific laws to which we Catholics are bound. But when obeying the law supplants faith and compassion, we have succumbed to our inner Pharisee. And our inner Pharisee, if not confronted and healed, merely "talks the talk," while Jesus calls us to walk his walk.

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# Catechism Theme: The Good News: God has sent his Son (CCC 422-425)

"You are the holy One of God!" Even demons recognized who Jesus was. In the person of Jesus, Son of Mary, God visited his people. Through the words and deeds of Jesus, God 's presence became tangible. "Wherever God acts, God is." God was present to the audience in the synagogue through Jesus, simply because the Son of God possessed a divine nature.

When we experience Jesus, his words and deeds change us. If he could heal one possessed, can't he heal us of our demons, sins, and failures? All we need to do is trust. Once we have seen and heard, once we have been healed, we are sent to proclaim the Good News to others. (See 1 John 1:1-4)

When was the last time you had a moment of grace: a time of divine insight and healing? Was that time a signpost in your life? Are you still affected by that graced moment? Explain.

Jesus came to proclaim the Good News. Sometimes he used words. And, sometimes he healed. But all his words and deed reflected a greater power: God's love. He was the instrument, the conduit of that love, for he is God. The holy One made God present in tangible ways. He still does.

What word would you like to hear God speak? How would you like to be healed? Take a few moments this week to listen to God and prepare yourself for his loving touch.
