In Touch with the Word

Jeremiah in the Well

Scripture:

•Jeremiah 38.4-6,8-10

Jeremiah is thrown into a well when he preaches an unpopular message. Although some believe his message, most do not.

•Hebrews 12.1-4

It is a struggle to be a follower of Jesus. But we are encouraged to keep running the race that lies ahead of us, and to keep our eyes fixed on Jesus.

•Luke 12.49-53

Jesus warns that even households will be divided over who will believe in him. In the same house, some will believe and some will not.

Theme:

Jeremiah is rejected by some who throw him into a well, but rescued by others who receive him. Jesus foresees the same thing happening to him, warning that what he stands for will even divide households – sons against fathers, mothers against daughters. Running with Christ is not an easy race to run, but if we keep our focus on our faith, we can finish the race despite the opposition we are sure to face.

Reflection:

Jerusalem is facing a major battle -- a battle they cannot win. If they surrender to the Babylonians, they will at least survive and not be killed. Jeremiah advises surrender, but no one wants to hear it. Instead of seeing him as a great prophet, he is seen as a threat to the confidence and morale of soldiers and citizens. He is thrown into a well as punishment.

- Have you ever been "punished" for speaking the truth that no one else wanted to hear? What happened?
- Who are some other people famous or not who have attempted to speak the truth, only to be punished by severe consequences such as loss of job, loss of reputation, or even death?

Throughout this whole reading, Jeremiah does not speak. We don't know if he is shaking his fist in anger, crying in fear, or if he is on his knees praying for a rescue from all that mud at the bottom of the well.

- Use your imagination. If you were in Jeremiah's situation, what would you be saying or thinking or doing?
- How do you usually respond when you are put in an uncomfortable or even dangerous situation because of someone else's actions?

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary - August 15

In Luke 1.39-56, Elizabeth and Mary recognize the work that God is doing through them. With eyes of faith they see the power and salvation of God breaking through into their lives and into the world.

Gather as a family and talk about what you know about Mary and her being a model of faith. Recall that we are celebrating a holy day, the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. On this day we remember that God took Mary to heaven, body and soul. Read together today's Gospel, Luke 1:39-56. In this reading we hear Mary's song of praise to God, the <u>Magnificat</u>. Invite each person in the family to write or draw one or more ways in which they see God working in your family life and in our world today. Use these prayers of thanksgiving to create your family's song of praise to God. We Are All Prophets By Fr. Mark Haydu, LC

Persecution is part of a prophet's life. Their strong messages are rarely met with open hearts even if conversion, rather than confrontation, is what the prophet seeks. Bartholomew, one of the Twelve Apostles, was preaching in India and Turkey in the first century and converted the Armenian king. But the king's brother had Bartholomew flayed alive. Jeremiah foretold the destruction of Jerusalem unless the people returned their hearts to the Lord. conversion was This call to considered demoralizing for those who wished to continue in their self-centered ways. His words were even crushing the soldiers! Either Jeremiah was quite the preacher, the soldiers were guilty—or both!

The fire of the prophet's words is meant as a call to action for the soul caught up in lukewarm stagnation. They should be uncomfortable.

When more than 2,000 bishops reflected on the Church at Vatican II, they insisted that every baptized Christian has a prophetic mission. We're called to shake things up. The role of the prophet is to examine in prayerful observation the signs of the times, and to read into them calls to action. Prophets listen with one ear to the Lord and another to society in order to speak wisely to their contemporaries.

This call to preach whether convenient or inconvenient was experienced by Christ. The flame that burned in his bosom was a desire to turn hearts toward his Father. Jesus didn't back down from preaching out of fear of rejection of the truth. Neither should we.
