# In Touch with the Word

# Discipline

# **Scripture:**

- •Isaiah 66.18-21. People from all nations will come and proclaim God's glory. These foreigners will be welcomed and honoured some even as priests.
- •Hebrews 12.5-7,11-13. God disciplines us with the same love and concern that mothers or fathers use to discipline their children. We need discipline to grow and be strong.
- •Luke 13.22-30. People from the north, south, east, and west will come and want a place at the feast of God. Yet some of those last shall enter first, and some of those first shall be last.

# Theme:

Isaiah tells us that people from every foreign land will be brought to Jerusalem by every means possible – camels, mules, carts, chariots, and the like. Some of these foreigners will be given the honour of priesthood. This is a surprise to Jews who are taught to avoid Gentiles. Jesus has a similar surprise for us – some people assumed to be rejected will be accepted, and some people expecting to be accepted will be rejected.

How can we improve our chances of admission through this narrow door? By heeding the gentle discipline that God gives us.

#### **Reflection:**

No one escapes pain and suffering; it comes with being mortal creatures. Yet, God brings good out of it by turning it into an opportunity for strengthening and disciplining us. Pain and suffering can be seen as the discipline of God.

- Is this clear in your life? Do you believe it to be true? Can suffering actually make you a better person? How has this been true in your life?
- How do you respond to suffering and problems? Has this response changed over the years? How are you different from when you were younger?

Discipline from God is different than discipline from the church, the government, your employer, or even your family.

- How do you respond to the enforcement of laws and policies that come from the church? from the government? from your employer? from your own parents or older relatives?
- Which of these sources of discipline are hardest to deal with? Which are the easiest? Why?
- If you have children, or if your work involves teaching or supervising children or young people, what kind of disciplinarian are you? What are the challenges of disciplining the young?

# FAMILY CONNECTION

Families take advantage of certain days throughout the year to celebrate individuals in the family and to make sure that they know that they are not taken for granted. As a family, recall all of the days that someone in the family was celebrated in the past year—birthdays, Mother's Day, Father's Day, anniversaries, graduations, and so on. Next, challenge each individual to recall what gifts were received on the day(s) on which he or she was celebrated.

Emphasize that these days are intended to express appreciation in a special way but are not meant to replace the appreciation that we should always show. Point out how, at times, families can take one another for granted. Explain that in this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus tells a story about some people who took something for granted and paid a price. Read aloud Luke 13:22-30. Explain that, in this story, some people took it for granted that they could enter the house whenever they wanted, but the master locked the gate and would not let them in after hours. Point out that Jesus was warning his listeners not to assume that they will have eternal life in heaven and not to take this invitation for granted. As a family, commit to showing appreciation for one another in the days ahead, striving to not take for granted any of the many things that family members do in their roles as parents and children.

# Just Come in the Side Door

A fragment from a church ceiling fresco crumbled and fell to the ground. It was eventually added to the Vatican collection. A piece of rubble that is now a priceless object of art depicts an apostle as he gazes upwards towards Christ's divine glory.

We too are striving to attain that heavenly vision, and in today's Gospel, Jesus advises us on how to realize it. We should strive to enter the smaller gate, the narrow door. It's not the grand main entrance that everyone sees and knows about. The narrow door is a less-traveled side entrance that only those who are close to the owner and his family know. Christ invites us to be so familiar with him that we know the side door.

Many pass the Master's house, know where it is, but have lost the practice of stopping inside. They know about God, even pray occasionally, and don't hurt anyone. No doubt not hurting others is admirable, but there is so much more for someone baptized into Christ. We're not called to merely avoid hurting others, but to have a deep, transforming experience of healing love that we then share with others.

Jesus' warning seems to be that when there is a mad rush to enter the front gate, those well-intentioned but out-of-practice souls who "don't know him" might find themselves struggling to squeeze in.

Jesus and the Church don't want that to happen to anyone. He invites us to get familiar, stop in often. He might say, "When you get here, just come in the side door!"

**RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)** is an incredible journey of discovery, the discovery of God's love in Jesus. If you or someone you know is interested in exploring the friendship and saving grace of Jesus Christ, we invite you to join us in the RCIA journey. It is a warm, welcoming experience that introduces the Christian faith in our Roman Catholic tradition. We explore topics such as Holy Scripture, the Sacraments, Church history and the core beliefs of the Church. Anyone who has taken this "leap of faith" has found it to be a life-altering experience.

The RCIA process is intended for those who are non-baptized. There are several rites and stages that are part of the process to prepare adults for Baptism and to receive the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil.

**Rite of Reception of Baptized Christians into the Full Communion of the Catholic Church.** If you have been baptized in another Christian tradition, the Catholic Church respects that baptism. Baptism is the sacrament of our rebirth in Christ and our immersion into His saving death and Resurrection. It can never be repeated. Reception into the Full Communion of the Catholic Church happens after a period of preparation through catechesis, prayer and worship, and an introduction to Catholic life, values, and mission.



Adults who have been baptized in the Catholic Church but have not received the Sacrament of Confirmation can prepare for reception of this sacrament through a period of catechesis and prayer.

#### **OFFERING A MASS**

Each time we offer up a Mass for someone, living or dead, we celebrate the greatest gift of our faith – the gift of Everlasting Life in Christ.
