PRAYER LIFE IN THE PARISH

The church is open Monday to Thursday from 9am to noon and 1pm to 4pm for private prayer (please use "Parish Hall" entrance). In addition, there are many opportunities to join together in prayer as a Parish family:




Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is an opportunity to pray to Jesus Christ before the Eucharist. Catholics believe the body, blood, soul and divinity are substantially present in the Eucharist. In other words, when you participate in Eucharistic Adoration, you pray and worship Jesus in a more intimate, present and real way.

Divine Mercy Devotion is a modern devotion to the attribute of God's infinite mercy that was promulgated by St. Faustina Kowalska in Poland, and later to the Universal Church by Pope St. John Paul II ("The Mercy Pope"). This devotion is multifaceted and has many different components: it involves a divinely inspired painting of Jesus with attached promises for its veneration, vocal prayers (the Divine Mercy chaplet and Divine Mercy Novena), a book (The Diary of Faustina Kowalska), a Holy Hour (3 o'clock), and a solemn feast day with attached indulgences (Divine Mercy Sunday). At St. Gerard's Parish the Divine Mercy Devotion follows the 9am Wednesday Mass.



Centering Prayer "is a receptive method of Christian silent prayer which deepens our relationship with God, the Indwelling Presence ... a prayer in which we can experience God's presence within us, closer than breathing, closer than thinking, closer than consciousness itself." Stations of the Cross devotion is led by a different parish group each Friday at 7pm during the Season of Lent. Parishioners gather to pray the Stations of the Cross and journey with Jesus through the Paschal Mystery. The Lenten Stations of the Cross begin Friday, March 7, 2025.



Communal Rosary Prayer During May, the Month of Mary, and October, the Month of the Holy Rosary, the Rosary Prayer is prayed communally prior to the 9am Sunday Holy Mass and each Monday at 5:30pm (led by the Knights of Columbus). Throughout the year the Rosary is prayer prior to the 9am weekday Holy Mass.

Our Liturgy Committee, with the help of all other Ministries observe Name Tag Sunday the first weekend of every month. Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper and Holy Mass with the Rite of Burning Palms

The day before Ash Wednesday the Knights of Columbus host a pancake supper. Following the supper is the Rite of Burning Palms. Parishioners are encouraged to bring palms from the previous Palm Sunday to add to the

brazier fire located in the drive-through. Holy Mass follows. Mark your calendar! Shrove Tuesday is March 4, 2025.



This past fall we held an eight-week **Bible Study** - "Unlocking the Mystery of the Bible" – which received a great response! The fall study program will continue in 2025.

The **World Day of Prayer** is a global ecumenical movement that brings Christians of many traditions together to observe a common day of prayer each year. Through preparation and participation in the worship service, we can learn how our sisters of other countries, languages and cultures understand the Biblical passages in their context. We can hear their concerns and needs and can join in solidarity with them as we pray with and for them. In this way, it is

possible to enrich our Christian faith as it grows deeper and broader in an international, ecumenical expression.

The 2025 WDP program "I Made You Wonderful" (written by the WDP Committee in the Cook Islands) invites us into the knowledge that each one of us was made with care and love by God. When we can receive this profound truth, everything in our life changes and we begin to radiate and shine from within. We also learn how to treat every other person as made wonderful by God.

SACRAMENTAL LIFE AT ST. GERARD

The Sacraments of Initiation

"The sacraments of Christian initiation - Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist - lay the foundations of every Christian life." (CCC 1212)

By Baptism, we share in Christ's death and resurrection. By Confirmation, we share in the gift of Pentecost. In Eucharist, we share in the food of heaven. This is why they are called sacraments of initiation - we are initiated into the community that holds the paschal mystery as its very life.

At St. Gerard Parish, our catechists journey with each family and provide guidance and support.



Baptism - The First Sacrament of Initiation

Through Baptism, God enables us to participate in his life in Jesus Christ and makes us his children. It is through this sacrament that we receive the Holy Spirit and become members of the People of God, of

the Body of Christ, which is the Church. Baptism becomes our commitment to grow in this new life and to strive to acquire spiritual maturity. By baptism, God purifies us from sin.

Baptism is the sacrament of faith which has the Risen Christ as its source, and it is the offer of salvation for all people. Intimately linked to Confirmation and to Eucharist, Baptism is, with these two sacraments, Christian Initiation. The child is baptized in the faith of his/her parents, of his/her godparents and of the Church.

Baptisms are celebrated following Sunday Mass, or at another time. Parents and godparents engage in a series of preparatory sessions to enrich and support their role as primary teacher of their children. There are several opportunities during the year for preparation classes.

*****All parents who would like to bring their children for baptism are asked to register for the Baptism Sessions by contacting the Parish Office. The next Preparation Sessions will be held January 9, 16 and 23rd. Childcare is provided. *****



Confirmation - The Second Sacrament of Initiation First Eucharist -The Third Sacrament of Initiation

In the Archdiocese of Regina, children in Grade 2 and older are invited to prepare to receive both the Sacrament of Confirmation and the Sacrament of First Eucharist at the same Holy Mass.

If you have not received a registration form, or for more information, please email the Parish Office office@stgerard.ca Please return the completed registration form to the Parish Office as soon as possible so that the required number of resources may be ordered in early January.

The Sacraments of Healing

First Reconciliation - At St. Gerard Parish, once a child has received the Sacrament of First Eucharist, s/he may prepare to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The First Reconciliation Preparation program is held each fall.

Reconciliation - Parish Penitential Services are scheduled during Advent and Lent. All baptized Catholics should receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation at least once each year and upon returning to the practice of the faith. At St. Gerard's individual confessions take place one-half hour prior to daily Mass and by phoning the Parish Office to make an appointment.

Anointing of the Sick – Whenever someone is very or chronically ill or elderly, the reception of the Sacrament of Anointing is appropriate. Opportunities for receiving this sacrament are by contacting the Parish Office to make an appointment with Father Antony.

If you have a loved one or friend who is hospitalized, please contact the Parish Office or phone Father Antony directly at 306.782.0323. The parish is no longer able to obtain a list of Roman Catholics who are hospitalized.

The Sacraments of Vocation

Matrimony – Couples preparing for Marriage participate in an extended preparation process. Please contact the Parish Office 12 months prior to the marriage date. In the Archdiocese of Regina, engaged couples are required to participate in a Marriage Preparation Program. These programs are offered in Regina, Calgary, and Muenster.
