RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA) is an incredible journey of discovery, the discovery of God's love in Jesus.

At St. Gerard, we have several catechumens who are preparing to be baptized at the Easter Vigil this April.

These catechumens will begin the period of final, more intense preparation for the sacraments of initiation at the Rite of Election at the 11am Mass on Sunday, March 1.

At this second step, on the basis of the testimony of godparents and catechists and of the catechumens' reaffirmation of their intention, the Church judges their state of readiness and decides on their advancement toward the sacraments of initiation. Thus the Church makes its "election," that is, the choice and admission of those catechumens who have the dispositions that make them fit to take part, at the next major celebration, in the sacraments of initiation. [para 106]

From the day of their election and admission, the catechumens are called "the elect." They are also described as competentes ("co-petitioners"), because they are joined together in asking for and aspiring to receive the three sacraments of Christ and the gift of the Holy Spirit. They are also called *illuminandi* ("those who will be enlightened"), because baptism itself has been called illuminatio ("enlightenment") and it fills the newly baptized with the light of faith. Ash Wednesday is this week! How are you going to prepare during Lent?

Create a prayer space in your home – A small table with a purple cloth and a cross or candle is all you need. Let it be a quick reminder to raise a prayer of thanks and praise.

Set out on a journey – We do not always journey in a straight line. Real spiritual growth often takes a more meandering path.

Spend time with the Blessed Sacrament – We all would benefit from some extra time spent at church in God's presence before the tabernacle, adoring and contemplating the gift of God's own self to us. This Eucharistic Adoration, like the celebration of the Eucharist, is a way to praise and thank God with our prayers and with our lives.

Journey through Lent with the Saints! Please pick up a copy today! Limited quantities are available in the Welcome Area. Also available are Lent Reflections for teens and a daily activity for children.

In Canada, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, in the Roman Rite, are days of fasting and abstinence from meat. In Canada, the law of "abstinence from meat" binds those who are 14 and older; the law of "fasting" binds those from 18 to 59 years of age.

Lent has a penitential character. During Lent, penance is an important requirement of Christian life. Fulfillment of this duty involves prayer, works of piety and charity, and self-denial by fulfilling one's obligations more faithfully and especially by observing the prescribed fast and abstinence.

Accentuating the Positive: Easier Said than Done By Fr. Mark Haydu, LC

Hate is a passion that can take over a person's heart in a short amount of time. God knows this, and he challenges us to avoid hate and holding grudges. In the law that Jesus preached, we are not even allowed to hate our enemies or persecutors. That is radical!

It is easy to let injuries build up over time. Eventually we find ourselves far away from those we should be closest to or those we once loved. This separation starts in our thoughts and settles into our hearts and behavior. Hate grows, and if it isn't controlled and redeemed, it can pull us down.

We don't have to hate, be anary, or carry grudges if we don't want to. Our hearts and minds can be filled with God's grace. We can work on three levels to overcome hate and anaer: visual, verbal, and physical. When angry thoughts invade your mind, look up (visual), speak the truth to yourself (verbal), and change your posture (physical). This helps alter self-destructive thought patterns and helps us refocus our heart and mind. Add these natural means to the supernatural means of calling on God's grace, of receiving the sacrament of penance, and of taking moments of prayer to see and speak his truth over a situation.

We are God's temple. His spirit of peace, mercy, and serenity needs to reign inside us. That means getting rid of negative, hateful, and hurtful thoughts toward ourselves and others. Don't let them pull you down!

"Love Your Enemies"

This Week...

Holiness and love are proclaimed with today's readings. But Jesus takes us a step further. We are to strive to be perfect. The old law to take "an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth" is no longer our law. We are to love even our enemies. We are to give to those who take from us and to let people hit us a second time after they have hit us a first time.

For Your Reflection

The old law about taking "an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth" was never meant to be a justification for excessive violence. It started out as a law *limiting* violence - take *no more than* a tooth for a tooth - because people were ready and willing to kill someone over a broken tooth. Jesus put a stop to that. To return violence for violence only continues its cycle, and it justifies violence instead of non-violence when settling conflicts.

- Why is the command "Love your enemies" hard to follow?
- Why is our culture so familiar with methods of violence, yet so ignorant of methods of non-violent conflict resolution?
- What do you think might end the cycle of violence?
- If someone is angry and wishes to do physical harm to you, what are your nonviolent options?
- When it comes to choosing between violent and nonviolent methods, does gender make any difference? If so, why? If not, why not?

It is a warm, welcoming experience that introduces the Christian faith in our Roman Catholic tradition. We explore topics such as Holy Scripture, the Sacraments, Church history and the core beliefs of the Church. Anyone who has taken this "leap of faith" has found it to be a life-altering experience.

The RCIA process is intended for those who are non-baptized. There are several rites and stages that are part of the process to prepare adults for Baptism and to receive the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil.

Rite of Reception of Baptized Christians into the Full Communion of the Catholic Church. If you have been baptized in another Christian tradition, the Catholic Church respects that baptism. Baptism is the sacrament of our rebirth in Christ and our immersion into His saving death and Resurrection. It can never be repeated. Reception into the Full Communion of the Catholic Church happens after a period of preparation through catechesis, prayer and worship, and an introduction to Catholic life, values, and mission.



Adults who have been baptized in the Catholic Church but have not received the Sacrament of Confirmation can prepare for reception of this sacrament through a period of catechesis and prayer.
