#### NATIONAL PASTORAL INITIATIVE FOR LIFE AND THE FAMILY (CCCB) Life in God draws us into a diverse unity, not division

In the Gospel, Jesus calls four men: Simon (Peter) and Andrews, James and John. Each of them sets down his net and follows Jesus. By the time the second reading was written, people had begun to follow Jesus' first followers and they had preferences, as we all do! Some of us prefer Pope Francis' witness while others loved Pope Benedict's theology. Some of us try to serve the poor as did Saint Teresa of Calcutta (Mother Teresa), at the same time others try to pray as did Mother Angelica. Saints and Popes, teachers and preachers all point us to Jesus. We need people of faith to teach and inspire us but, ultimately, we all follow Jesus. The diversity of charism, prayer, devotion, service and practice in the Church needs to be held in unity. Otherwise, we give into the temptation to division, which detracts from our ability to participate in God's loving and healing the world.

#### "SUNDAY OF THE WORD OF GOD" Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Without the Lord who opens our minds to them, it is impossible to understand the Scriptures in depth. #### RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)

is an incredible journey of discovery - the discovery of God's love in Jesus.

Although the RCIA process is intended for those who are non-baptized, at St. Gerard we also prepare adults for the Rite of Reception of Baptized Christians (including Catholics) into the Full Communion of the Catholic Church.

Reception into the Full Communion of the Catholic Church happens after a period of preparation through catechesis, prayer and worship, and an introduction to Catholic life, values, and mission. Adults who have been baptized in the Catholic Church but have not received the Sacrament of Confirmation can prepare for reception of this sacrament through a period of catechesis and prayer.

Reception into Full Communion will be celebrated at the 11am Mass on Sunday, February 2<sup>nd</sup>.

#### His First Followers By Fr. Mark Haydu, LC

We began the Church year with the foundations of our Christian life. We focused on our baptismal call to preach the word of God. Now we focus on the call of the first apostles.

The last part of today's Gospel reading, about Jesus calling his first disciples, is displayed in a painting in the Sistine Chapel, *Calling of the Apostles* by Domenico Ghirlandaio. In the artwork, The Sea of Galilee spreads out behind Jesus, who is front and center. Several towns line the shore and remind us of Capernaum, where Jesus lived and near the area where he called his first followers.

Two apostles kneel in front of Jesus; another pair stand behind him. Their gestures and postures reveal their interior attitudes. One apostle crosses his arms in acceptance while another prayerfully looks up at Jesus. The third apostle, behind Jesus, has his hand at his chest as if to say, "Are you sure you want me?" The fourth seems to look away. Many others surround Jesus, but not all of them are called to be apostles.

The call of Jesus is real. He may not ask us to leave behind our business or family, but he does ask for the same totality of trust and following. The result of fully saying yes to this call is what the first reading proclaims: "You have brought them abundant joy / and great rejoicing; / They rejoice before you as people rejoice at harvest...." (Isaiah 9:2). The Joy of the Gospel that Pope Francis proclaimed in his 2013 apostolic exhortation is exactly this: that joy that comes from a sincere and generous yes to Jesus' call to be a disciple.

#### This Week...

We have opportunities we must respond to without delay. Simon, Andrew, James, and John immediately abandon their nets to follow Jesus without delay. We do not have time to waste in the darkness and gloom. It is time to unite and to recognize Jesus as the One who unites us. It is time to walk in the light, dance with joy, and be fishers of men and women for Jesus.

#### For Your Reflection

Simon, Andrew, James, and John drop their nets the second that Jesus shows up. They leave their fish and boats in the water and start a whole new life. Imagine Zebedee's thoughts as he watches his two sons walk off with someone he knows little about.

- What would your parents say if you tried to do something like that?
- How could you explain the importance of following Jesus to your parents if they had never heard of him or knew little about him?

These four fishermen did not miss the chance to answer Jesus' invitation.

- "Strike while the iron is hot" and "Opportunity knocks but once" are old sayings. Have you heard these sayings before? What do they really mean?
- Have you ever chosen to take advantage of an opportunity right away, and it turned out to be a good decision? If so, when? What happened?
- Have you ever chosen to take advantage of what you thought was a good opportunity, and it turned out to be a bad decision? If so, when? What happened?
- How can you begin to tell the good opportunities from the bad ones?

If you or someone you know is interested in exploring the friendship and saving grace of Jesus Christ, we invite you to join us in the RCIA journey. It is a warm, welcoming experience that introduces the Christian faith in our Roman Catholic tradition. We explore topics such as Holy Scripture, the Sacraments, Church history and the core beliefs of the Church. Anyone who has taken this "leap of faith" has found it to be a life-altering experience.

The RCIA process is intended for those who are non-baptized. There are several rites and stages that are part of the process to prepare adults for Baptism and to receive the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil.

**Rite of Reception of Baptized Christians into the Full Communion of the Catholic Church.** If you have been baptized in another Christian tradition, the Catholic Church respects that baptism. Baptism is the sacrament of our rebirth in Christ and our immersion into His saving death and Resurrection. It can never be repeated. Reception into the Full Communion of the Catholic Church happens after a period of preparation through catechesis, prayer and worship, and an introduction to Catholic life, values, and mission.
