Gospel Reading


Mark 3.20-35 Whoever does the will of God is brother and sister and mother to me.

Families are places of beginnings. Within our family, we first learn what it means to be part of a community. We share a closeness and experience mutual understanding and support. We learn how to love one another, how to ask for and receive forgiveness, and how to apply all these lessons to the world outside our homes.

As you gather as a family, talk about what makes your family special. Share some of the lessons you have learned together about love, forgiveness, and understanding. Then read today's Gospel, Mark 3:20-35. Jesus wants us to understand that by doing God's will, we are part of a bigger family. Choosing to follow Jesus, being his disciple, means we must treat one another with kindness and mercy. We must become a family. Conclude by asking God to bless your family and to help you do God's will by seeing all his people with the same kind of love and compassion. Pray together the Lord's Prayer and the Hail Mary.

YOUTH CONNECTION FOR THE TENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



REDEFINING FAMILY – In Mark 3:20–35, Jesus faces opposition. His own family and religious leaders accuse Him of being possessed by evil. Jesus uses this moment to teach an important lesson. Jesus says that those who do the will of God are His true family. This means that spiritual kinship is more important than blood relations. Obedience to God makes us part of Jesus' family.

We are invited to examine our own understanding of community and spiritual kinship. We are called to embrace our fellow believers as brothers and sisters in Christ, irrespective of societal or familial divisions. Through this redefinition of family, we are challenged to extend the boundaries of our love, acknowledging the unity we share as part of God's spiritual family.

FAITH AND HARDSHIP - In 2 Corinthians 4:13-5:1, Paul talks about faith during difficult times. He encourages believers to stay strong. Despite the hardships they face, they look forward to eternal glory.

Paul reminds us that our troubles are temporary. They prepare us for the eternal life with God. Our focus should be on what is unseen and eternal.

This passage encourages us to keep our faith strong. No matter what challenges we face, we trust in God's promises. Our hope in eternal life gives us strength.

FACING OPPOSITION – Jesus faced many challenges during His ministry. His own family did not understand Him. Religious leaders opposed Him. Despite this, Jesus stayed focused on His mission. We, too, may face opposition in our lives. People may not understand our faith. They might challenge us. But like Jesus, we must remain committed to God's will.

Heavenly Father, thank You for Your love and mercy. Help us stay strong in our faith and follow Your will. May we always remember that we are part of Your family. Guide us and give us strength in our daily lives. Amen.

The Family of Jesus The Redemptorists

The account of Jesus' encounter with his family appears in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke. In our translation of Mark's Gospel, Jesus explains, "Whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother" (Mark 3:35). In Luke's Gospel, the translation reads, "My mother and my brothers are those who hear the word of God and act on it" (Luke 8:21). It seems rude, this famous response of Jesus to the message that his family is waiting for him. But perhaps it was simply another teachable moment about who constitutes Jesus' family. Jesus embraces all who hear him — and act on what he says — as his brothers and sisters.

The first task is to hear. We live in a noisy world full of false prophets, and the gifts of listening and discernment must be practiced daily. When we do hear, we must act. "Sentiment without action is the ruin of the soul," said Edward Abbey.

The definition of family has expanded. Jesus started the expansion movement. With him, there are no divisions, no separation among people. We are all brothers and sisters of Jesus if we do the will of his Father, who is our Father. It becomes clear that Jesus is my brother, the victim of sex trafficking is my sister, the child dying of thirst or hunger is my child, the homeless man is my uncle, the girl ostracized because of her sexual orientation is my cousin. The list is endless. The only people who earned Jesus' scorn were the hypocrites, never the victims, the bullied, or the misunderstood. **†**

DEVELOPMENT AND PEACE UPDATES

Development & Peace, Share Lent - Under the overarching five-year theme *Create Hope*, the theme this year was Reaping our Rights. Funds will be used to support the small-scale peasant farmers who feed the world while caring for the Earth. Three partners on three continents were selected, to help communities become more resilient, practice agro ecology, diversify their incomes, or assert their rights in the face of land contamination. The Share Lent campaign was very successful and has raised \$2,247,548.56 so far.

Development & Peace, Stand for the Land -Around the world, people who defend the environment, water and land are often threatened, criminalized, imprisoned and even killed. The communities of Guapinol and the San Pedros region in northern Honduras were severely impacted when an iron ore mine was granted a license to mine in Carlos Escalaros National Park. Three Guapinol people were murdered, 8 families were dispossessed, and 32 were charged for defending their land, water, and right to safety.

The Stand for the Land petition last fall was a D & P call for solidarity with the people of Honduras. 52,629 concerned Canadians signed the petition, far surpassing their goal of 32,000 signatures. The petition was presented to the Honduran Ambassador on April 25, 2024.
