No. The Catechism stands beside the other catechetical documents such as, Evangelii Gaudium, Catechesi Tradendae, Evangelii Nuntiandi, the Directory for Catechesis, and catechetical documents of episcopal conferences. These documents create part of the context in which the Catechism is received and mediated to the particular circumstances of the local or national Church. The Catechism is intended to be a resource for the continuing renewal of catechesis and the development of future catechetical materials. What are the parts of the Bible?
