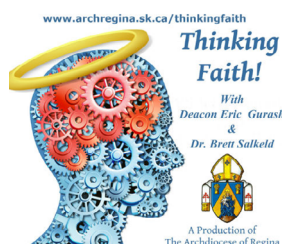

When Youth Group Can't Gather:

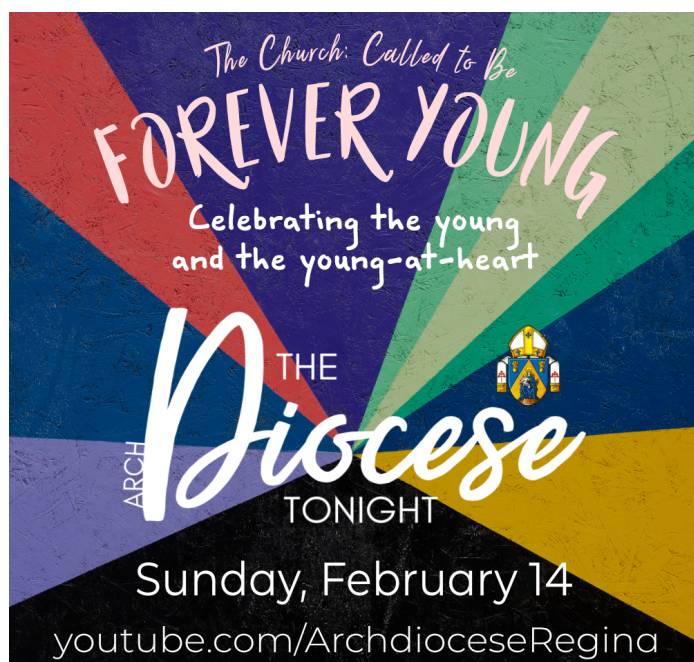
