Parish Scam Alert: Fraudulent Information Requests

We've been made aware of a scam currently targeting parishes in which an individual sends an email pretending to be someone known to the parish office (e.g., a staff member, priest, or volunteer). The email may request a copy of the parish directory or other lists in order to access personal contact information.

Important Warning Signs:

The email comes from an address that does not match the official address of the person named.

The message may have urgent or vague language asking for help or access to data.

What to Do:

Do not respond or provide any information.

Double-check the email address carefully—scammers often use similar-looking domains.

Report the email to your parish office and your IT support or diocesan communications office. Do not click any links or download attachments from suspicious emails. Protecting the privacy of our parishioners is critical. Thank you for staying alert and helping keep our communities safe!
